

Summary Vetting Requirements & Event Information TOORAWEEENAH 2* Y/O & 1* Y/O Categories

Please be familiar with AERA Rules & Policies and the 2025 FEI Endurance Rules; and for FEI entrants to make themselves familiar with the FEI qualification process and final Schedule for the Event -

It will be the responsibility of FEI Riders/Trainers to ensure that all paperwork & requirements are in place prior to entering.

1. Entries for all Tooraweenah Events will open on 21st March 2026. Closing date for all entries will be 11:00pm, Wednesday 1st April 2026 as per FEI requirements of 10 days prior to pre-ride vetting.
2. A full refund policy via AERAOnline up until 27th March 2026. After that time, refunds will be considered via email discussion to canobolasendurance@gmail.com and any agreed refunds will be made after the event.
3. Once nominations open, if you wish to nominate several horses to enter one of the FEI categories, please advise Annette Bailey via email at canobolasendurance@gmail.com. Annette is managing the FEI side of the Tooraweenah event for the Tooraweenah Endurance club.
4. An FEI horse and/or rider must complete the FEI novice requirements to enter an FEI Event as per <https://inside.fei.org/content/fei-endurance-rules-2025> Section 832.
 - If the FEI horse and/or rider is a Novice under the AERA Novice rules (including the 13-month rule), they must follow the Novice restrictions set down by the AERA Rules <https://www.aera.asn.au/index.php/administration/rules-and-policies>.
 - As per AERA Rule 27, no novice horse or rider can enter an endurance event greater than 120km.
 - The FEI Clause 839 Mandatory Out of Competition requirements must be followed for FEI horses.
5. A 4 day Horse Health Temperature log must be maintained for all AERA and FEI horses.
 - FEI horses must also commence their Temperatures in their FEI HorseApp 3 days prior to arrival and then continue taking am/pm temperatures for the duration of their stay at the ride base.
6. FEI riders/trainers are asked to present to a member of the Ground Jury for your horse to be inspected on arrival at the camp.
 - During the actual event, all FEI horses will have their old period in an allocated area insight of FEI Officials.
 - AERA horses may return to their camps during the actual event for their compulsory hold times.

Vet Gate into Hold Procedures for all CEI/FEI & AERA Elevator Event –

1. **Every horse** (AERA and FEI) has 15 minutes to reach 64bpm before presenting to the vets. It has one more opportunity to present within 15 minutes if it has not sufficiently recovered.
 - As per FEI Clause 816.6.5, if an **FEI horse** does not reach 64bpm in 10 minutes but does so within 15 minutes, there will be a compulsory represent prior to starting the next loop/leg. This will be managed by the FEI Ground Jury and the AERASpace computer system at the ride.
 - FEI Clause 816.6.5 does not apply to AERA horses.

- However, as is the norm for any ride, it is at the vets' discretion if they wish to ask any AERA horse to represent before going out on course.
 - Any horse (AERA and FEI) will be eliminated from the competition if they do not reach 64bpm in 15 mins after timing in off course for each loop/leg.
 - For the final loop/leg every horse (AERA and FEI) will have one opportunity to reach 64bpm in 20 mins.
2. As per 2025 FEI Clause 807.5, all FEI horses MUST depart onto the next loop/leg within 15 minutes of their departure time or be disqualified.
- FEI Clause 807.5 *does not apply to AERA horses*.
3. Any disputes at the Event will be managed via the AERA Chief Steward for AERA horses, and FEI Chief Steward & President of the Ground Jury for FEI horses. This will be elaborated on at the compulsory Pre-ride talk.

Winner of the Tooraweenah 120km Elevator Event incorporating 1* & 2* categories -

The **outright winner of the Tooraweenah ride** will be either the first successful MWT, HWT, or 1st FEI 2* Open combination to successfully complete the ride with the fastest winning time.

- If a 2* Open rider is considering being competitive for line honours, ensure that riding weight is 73kg and over at weigh-in before, during and at the completion of the ride.
- As per FEI and AERA Rules, a safe gallop finish will be allocated.
 - Note – as per AERA rules, there can be a joint winner if horses are AERA horses.
 - There can be no joint winner if one or any of the horses is an FEI 2* horse.
- 1st -3rd Placings will be awarded in each 2* and 1* Youth and Open categories.
- Best Conditioned Awards will be recognised for 2* Y/O and 1* Y/O categories as per FEI requirements
- All 2* and 1* Youth and Open completions will receive completion awards.
