HOW DO I FIND RIDE BASE?

The address is accurate within 200 metres. Once you hit the dirt road follow all signage to ride base. It's 7km of dirt road

IS THERE WATER?

BYO drinking water! There will be plenty of horse water available in tubs around the campground. Additionally there will be water drops on Friday and Saturday to campsites.

WHAT DO WE DO WITH OUR RUBBISH?

There will be a skip bin in the middle of the camp grounds for human rubbish. Horse manure, old hay etc can be spread across the ground.

IT'S MY FIRST RIDE, WHAT DO I DO WHEN I ARRIVE?

Once you have set up camp, come to the Ride Office to receive your riding number. Here you will find more information on all things about the ride and vetting procedure.

CAN I KEEP MY HORSE IN ANY TYPE OF YARD?

No. Australian Endurance (AERA) has a standard to ensure safety and consistency. Panelled yards or electric fencing using two strands of 1cm wide tape. More info in link below.

ONCE MY HORSE HAS VETTED THROUGH THE RIDE, CAN I LEAVE?

No not exactly! For horse welfare reasons you cannot immediately leave. Your horse's daycard or logbook must be signed off by the Head Vet before you can load your horse up! If you need to leave earlier you will need to speak with the Chief Steward and Head Vet.

WHEN CAN MY HORSE RETIRE FROM THE 120KM?

The 120km elevator is a 4 leg ride. This means you will be able to retire after leg 2 at 82km or after leg 3 at 104km.
